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Directions to the SWELL meeting

Participants should arrive at Bern's main central station. Timetables for your journey can be found on the SBB/CFF/FFS website: www.sbb.ch. Information on buses and trams within Bern can be found at www.bernmobil.ch, but the important information that you'll need for the journeys to the workshop and to dinner are detailed below.

The locations of the day's events – the workshop (Hallerstrasse 6, Room 205, on the second floor), the lunch (Länggassstübli, at Muesmattstrasse 46) and the apéro and dinner (Kornhauskeller, Kornhausplatz 18 (http://www.kornhaus.org/kkeller.html)) can be seen on the map at the bottom of these directions:

Arriving at the workshop:

To get from the station to the workshop location, there are a number of possibilities:

- If you leave the station by the main exit on Bahnhofplatz, you can take bus number 12, in the direction of Länggasse and get off at "Universität" (and walk a little further along the Länggassstrasse before turning right onto Hallerstrasse), or at "Mittelstrasse" (and walk back a little way before turning left onto Hallerstrasse). The bus leaves in the area of Box F5 on the first page of http://mct.sbb.ch/mct/infra_services-uebersicht-bahnhofplaene-bern-a4.pdf
- 2. You can also leave the station at Ausgang West C3 on the hyperlinked map this will bring you to Schanzenstrasse, where you can catch the Number 12 bus again, this time from the "Schanzenstrasse" stop, in the direction of Länggasse.
- 3. Alternatively, you can leave by the Grosse Schanze exit of the station which brings you to the front of the main University buildings. There is a lift from the track level (see E5 on the hyperlinked map), right up to the Grosse Schanze at E1. The platform at the Grosse Schanze affords the visitor a wonderful view over the rooftops of the city. To reach the workshop you can then walk between the two large University main buildings, then bear left to join Falkenplatz, turn right, and walk a little way before turning right onto Hallerstrasse.

Getting to Lunch:

We'll all be able to go together from the workshop to lunch which is reached by walking further up the Länggassstrasse, away from the station, and turning left




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onto Muesmattstrasse, the street that is immediately after the Unitobler building on the left hand side of the road. People wishing to take the 12 bus should get on at "Universität" or "Mittelstrasse" and get off at "Unitobler", in the direction of Länggasse.

Getting to dinner:

Our apéro and dinner will be held within the UNESCO World Heritage site of Bern's Old Town at the Kornhauskeller, built between 1711 and 1718 by Hans Jakob Dünz. To get there from the Workshop take the number 12 bus in the direction of the Zentrum Paul Klee, getting off at Zytglogge. Once off the bus, walk back past the Zytglogge and turn right and the large Kornhaus is on the left, just past the Chindlifresser, the child-eating ogre. The easiest way to get back to the station after the dinner is by taking tram number 9 (in the direction of Wabern) or bus number 10 (in the direction of Köniz Schliern), the Zytglogge stop for both of which is next to the Chindlifresser just outside the Kornhauskeller.
